## **REPORT: OLD YEAR TOUR**

We headed out of the city, all meeting at the Cape Town International Airport, just before 09h00 on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> December. The route chosen for our trip to *Swartberg Country Manor* was via the N2 and, of course, as per usual, first stop is Peregrine, where coffees and cappuccinos were the order of the day! We left the N2 at *Swellendam* and took the fabulous road up the *Tredouw Pass to Barrydale*, where another stop was made to fetch Siptje and John who were joining us on tour. We spent a lovely lunch hour at *Diesel and Crème* who have a 'fabulous' system going – you place your order at an on site caravan and 'speedily' it is delivered to your table. Their coffee milk shakes are legendary.

We arrived at the Swartberg Country Manor just after 3.30pm – and from the very start one feels instantly at home when Leonie, Riaan (GM of the Hotel) and Dean our hostess for the period we were there, met us in the car park – their website says, "THE PERFECT GETAWAY TO RE-DISCOVER YOUR SOUL" and this could not be truer! Food is sublime, served by their chef, Pierre and his assistant – Fresh fruit / yoghurts and home baked breads make sure you start the day off on the correct footing! We enjoyed all our evening meals which are quite honestly wholesome and hearty and ever so tasty.

On our first day we left at 09h00 to head to the *Swartberg Pass* – Chris our coach driver, is a mine of information and gave us interesting anecdotes the whole way up the pass. The summit of the Swartberg Pass is at 1583m with an altitude of 1568m. – (Higher by far than Table Mountain at 1068m!) When finally, after many stops, Chris suggested another short stop at the base of the pass where the road has a little stream running over it; this was most welcome – a great morning spent on the pass.

There was sufficient time to browse **Prince Albert** – After lunch we took the road past **Klaarstroom and Meiringspoort** – and ending up in **De Rust** for a short while. Riaan had suggested we take the gravel road from just outside De Rust eventually coming out very close to the **Cango Caves** – this ordinarily would have been a 'short cut' saving more than 50km – However, it turned out that recent rains had caused problems with the surface of the road, and we were on a windy, twisty road for over an hour – with many negative comments – they quickly turned 'positive' once we were back on terra-firma with the tar road!

A short rest and then everyone dressed in WHITE for the Old Year party gathered on the patio. They started dinner very early (19h45 and so dinner seemed to be over by just after 21h00) – However, this did not deter anyone as music was put on & the dancing began – resulting in our group being told 'that for our age we did better than guests half our age!' What fun we had, and of course, the countdown to midnight came very quickly and the evening was MOST ENJOYABLE with everyone staying until well after midnight – a first for Old Year tours as often people fade earlier than midnight!

Next morning, we all had a LATE breakfast and then relaxed the morning away – some at the pool; some under their stunning trees; some on their patio horizontally. They served us a fabulous lunch of freshly baked breads and salad on their patio.

In the early afternoon we drove up to **Jan Se Gat** and must say did enjoy the view from this restaurant 5km from Swartberg Country Manor – but not much else! The restaurant lacks atmosphere, but this didn't stop the group of ladies idly chatting away.

Sadly, our last day had come – and it was time to leave. Their chef had very kindly baked us all breads to take home and on leaving Swartberg Country Manor there was a wheelbarrow full of marrows waiting for us to take back to Cape Town with us! Country Hospitality at its finest – and it was 'emotional' saying goodbye to Leonie and Riaan.

We will return – an art course in winter is the carrot dangling at present and sounds fabulous.



After that, we visit the Sesriem Canyon, a life-sustaining natural phenomenon in the heart of the Namib Desert.
